Notice of Race

1 RULES

- 1.1 The Regatta will be governed by the rules defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing 2017-2020.
- 1.2 The YNZ Safety Regulations Part 1 shall apply
- 1.3 The 29er One Design Class Rules will apply
- 1.4 Appendix T will apply

2. ADVERTISING

2.1 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the Organising Authority.

3. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 The Regatta is open to all boats of the 29er class.
- 3.2 Eligible boats may enter online at www.boiyc.org by Sunday 24 May 2020.
- 3.3 Late entries will be accepted up to 1600 Thursday 28th May 2020, note the higher fee.
- 3.4 To be eligible to compete in this event each helm and crew member shall be a financial member of a club recognised by the helm and crew member's national authority.
- 3.5 Each helm and crew shall be a financial member of the New Zealand 29er Association or a 29er Association affiliated to the International 29er Association.

4. Classification

4.1 The following classification requirements will apply (see rule 79): Nil.

6.7 On Monday 1st June no warning signal will be made after 15:00

7. Measurement

- 7.1 Each boat shall be presented to the Regatta measurer (Clause 6.2 above)
- 7.2 All boats must comply with their class rules at all times during the Regatta. No equipment that is subject to measurement under 29er class rules may be changed during the Regatta without the approval of the Chairman of the Race Committee
- 7.3 Wet clothing, measurement and equipment checks may be made throughout the Regatta at the discretion of the Race Committee or Protest Committee.

8. Sailing Instructions

8.1 The sailing instructions will be available at Registration and will be posted on the Bay or Islands Yacht Club website when available.

9. Venue

- 9.1 The Regatta will be based at Bay of Islands Yacht Club
- 9.2 Racing will take place as shown on Attachment 1

10 The Courses

The courses to be sailed will be Windward/Leeward 10.1

11 Penalty System

11.1 For the 29er class rule 44.1, Taking A Penalty, is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by a One-Turn Penalty

12. Scoring

- 12.1 The Low Point Scoring System of Appendix A, Scoring, will apply
- 12.2 Five races are required to be completed to constitute a series
- 12.3 a) Until five races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
 - b) When from five to eight races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
 - c) When nine or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores

13 Support Boats

The movements of support boats will be restricted 13.1

14 Launching Restrictions

14.1 Unless otherwise directed by the organising Authority, all competing boats and equipment shall be launched and retrieved from the BOIYC Ramp

15. Radio Communication

15.1 Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

16 Prizes

- 16.1 Prizes will be awarded to the first three youth boats, the first three all girl boats and the first open team in the Regatta. There may be other prizes awarded by the Organising Authority.
- 16.2 The top New Zealand entrant will be the New Zealand champion for 2020 and will be awarded the 29er Association of New Zealand trophy.

17 Disclaimer of Liability

17.1 Competitors participate in the Regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race.

The organising authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the Regatta.

18 Insurance

18.1 All boats should have appropriate insurance cover.
